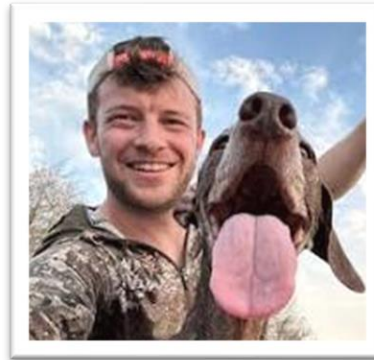

- Review ACEP's advocacy wins and opportunities relative to: boarding and ED crowding, workplace violence, career transitions, reimbursement / no surprises act, and Workforce / scope of practice

- Prepare for MOC testing requirements
